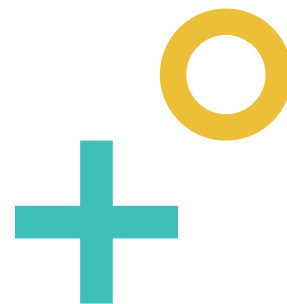

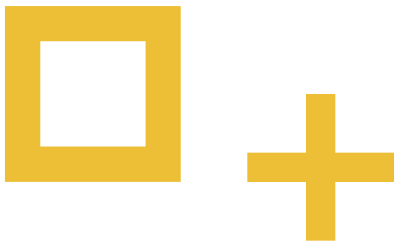

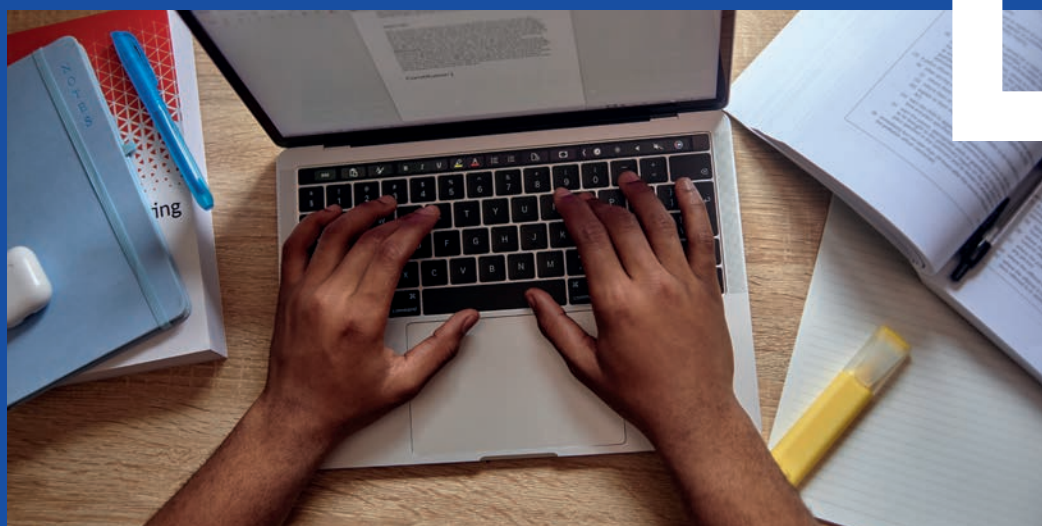

Blended Learning at VC

Changes in the way the world works have altered how we approach teaching.

Lecturers will use the face-2-face sessions to teach application, problem solving, creative and critical thinking. Our learning management system (LMS), called *arc*, is used to expose our students to both content and collaborative

learning opportunities with their peers.

An example of such collaboration includes participating in conversations with your peers on the discussion board and/or commenting on your peers' blogs. 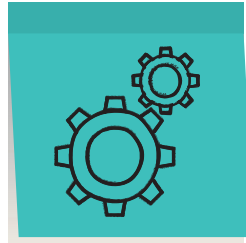

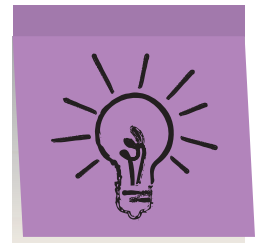

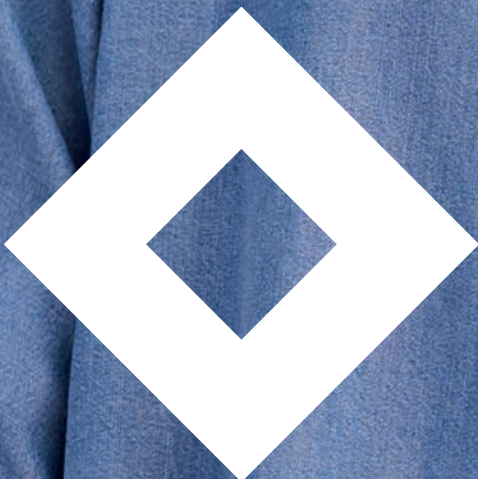
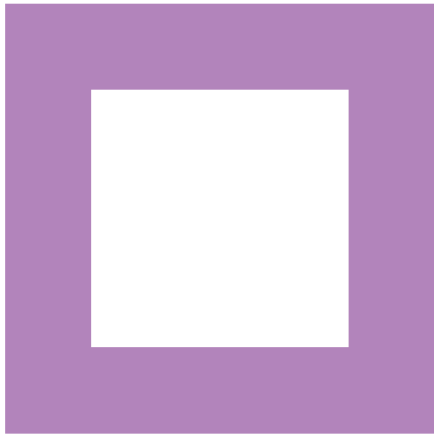


School of Engineering

Academic Staff

Our lecturers are committed to combining industry knowledge with teaching and learning strategies, giving students insight into the world of work.

Lecturers connect in a vibrant online community to keep abreast of new technologies, enhance learning and network globally on progressive teaching methods. They are guided by a campus-based support team which includes an Educational Technologist, and Teaching and Learning Specialists.

Campus academic teams stay up to speed with the best teaching practices. Our teaching team is provided with development opportunities throughout the year, supported by a peer review process that inspires lecturers to reflect and improve on their teaching practices.

Smaller Classes

We keep our classes small – on average only 60 students, with the largest class being less than 160. This ensures that you aren't an anonymous face in a 500-seater auditorium. Smaller classes encourage you to develop relationships with your lecturers and peers, ask questions, formulate arguments, express opinions and develop critical thinking skills.

Keeping You on Track

Progress is monitored by a Programme Coordinator – a lecturer who keeps an eye on your overall academic performance and can assist you with any challenges.



Putting It Into Practice

Our Work Integrated Learning (WIL) programme gives you, guided by your WIL lecturers, the opportunity to step outside the lecture room and gain real insight into your chosen field of study. There are 2 components: Simulated Activity and Working in Industry – and it's not uncommon for WIL students to be offered permanent positions post-graduation.

Up to Speed

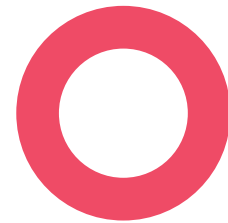

Academic Support

Working closely with the Head: Academic and Campus Faculty Heads are Teaching and Learning Specialists and Ed Tech Specialists – passionate education experts who collaborate with lecturers.

Our team of academic experts make education about you. And it starts with your goals; we help guide you to achieve them, with regular check-ins throughout your academic journey.

Students need the skills and academic literacy to develop their ability to write effectively using informed sources, and to reflect critically on new knowledge. Should you find yourself facing challenges, a member of the academic team is there to assist you any time at our writing centre.

Whether it's time management, study skills, assignment writing, applying the correct referencing techniques to avoid plagiarism, or exam preparation, students who use these

Our Teaching and Learning Specialists and Ed Tech Specialists also identify and nurture best teaching practice in lecturers, and conduct peer reviews evaluating teaching skills with the aim of improving delivery to students.

Student Wellness

Finding Balance

Learning goes beyond the lecture room. We believe that finding the right balance between academics, sports and social activities contributes to overall academic success and student wellness. That's why our student offering includes a variety of activities so that each student can find their place to thrive.

Student Wellness Specialist (SWS)

Your Student Wellness Specialist/Student Counsellor is your on-campus registered professional and experienced counsellor (registered with either the SACSSP or HPCSA). The Student Wellness Specialist/Student Counsellor is tasked with promoting your holistic development and wellbeing through one-on-one counselling consultations, awareness campaigns, and community engagement and citizenship initiatives, which are conducted with the help of the VC Cares Committee.

Your Student Wellness Specialist/Student Counsellor is available to discuss any important difficulties you may be experiencing, both professionally and confidentially, and will work with you to develop new ways of managing your concerns. Your Student Wellness Specialist/Student Counsellor offers predominantly short-term counselling and psychotherapy, while abiding by strict confidentiality guidelines. The aim of counselling is to ensure that the impact of whichever personal, emotional, psychological, or academic difficulty you may be experiencing does not deter your ability to perform optimally. Your Student Wellness Specialist/Student Counsellor will provide you with a toolkit to benefit you in all spheres of your life.

Awareness Campaigns

Your Student Wellness Specialist/Student Counsellor, with the assistance of the VC Cares Committee, co-ordinates a range of awareness campaigns on campus, tailored to the needs of our students. These campaigns are designed to create a sense of belonging and a culture of sharing information to encourage healthy conversations and raise awareness. These awareness campaigns run throughout the academic year, are informative and interactive, and discuss a range of themes including diversity, inclusivity, stress, anxiety and more.

Community Engagement

We aim to instil a sense of citizenship and social responsibility by encouraging students to get involved in community engagement initiatives. The Student Wellness Specialist and the VC Cares Committee provide students with the opportunity to participate in various outreach programmes for disadvantaged schools and Non-Profit Organisations. 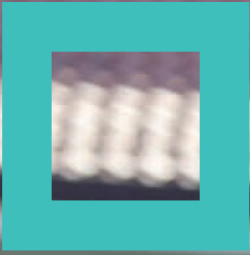

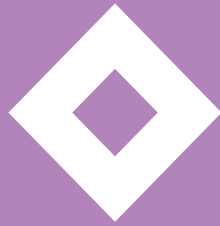
