

IIE Higher Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education

Faculty of Education

The IIE Higher Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education is an entry level/introductory qualification (at NQF Level 5) to the study of early childhood development (ECD) education from birth through to 4 years of age. It is intended to provide students with "basic introductory knowledge, cognitive and conceptual tools and practical techniques to enable further study in ECD" (DHET, 2017: 24).

This one-year higher certificate is structured in accordance with The Department of Higher Education and Training's (DHET) Policy on Minimum Requirements for Programmes Leading to Qualifications in Higher Education for Early Childhood Development Educators (2017), and with the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) for Children from Birth to Four Policy (2015). In addition, it is aligned to the HEQSF guidelines, and will provide students with the beginning knowledge, skills and applied competences identified to be critical for facilitation at this level. Graduates will be well prepared with insight and skills that are both employable and relevant to further specialisation study in support of the principles of life-long learning.

Timetables

This qualification is aimed at students who wish to complete full-time face-to-face studies for the duration of their qualification. This means that students are expected to be available throughout the day for class in the academic year depending on how the timetable is structured. Students may also be required to write assessments or submit coursework or assignments outside of normal class time. Students who would like to pursue part time employment opportunities outside of the academic programme must prioritise their studies and avoid committing to work schedules until after they have received their timetables and academic calendar from the institution. Students must also note that timetables remain subject to change throughout the academic year.

Languages

If a student has an African language (excluding Afrikaans) as part of his/her NSC or equivalent, they may receive an academic credit. Should a student wish to claim proficiency in an African language (excluding Afrikaans), then the student is required to pass a proficiency test in order to demonstrate competency in such language and receive academic credit for this module.

Proficiency tests are offered in four (4) official languages only, namely isiXhosa, isiZulu, Northern Sotho (Sepedi) and Setswana on

The IIE campuses.

Note: Languages offered are campus dependent.

If proficiency is claimed in another African language (excluding Afrikaans) other than the four listed above, the onus is on the student to provide evidence of NQF Level 5, or higher competency in that language.

Work Integrated Learning (i.e. ECD Experience - ECDX5112):

Early Childhood Experience is an integral part of any Early Childhood Care and Education programme and grants students an opportunity to work within an authentic Early Childhood Development (ECD) environment. Students will be required to complete a minimum of 6-weeks in work-integrated learning (3-weeks in Online Supplementary Activities and 3 weeks in an ECD Centre working with age groups 2-4 years). The three (3) weeks ECD Centre-based Experience must take place in a suitable, registered South African ECD Centre (as determined by the institution) within reasonable range of one of The IIE's Varsity College/ IIE MSA campuses.

Access on to Work Integrated Learning (i.e. ECD Experience):

The HCECCE Student is required to meet specific criteria for entrance into the School/ECD Centre for ECD Experience. The following is important in this regard:

Police clearance certificates:

All HCECCE students are required to provide a valid South African Police Clearance Certificate or an Afiswitch Criminal Check Certificate on commencement of their ECD Centre-based Experience.

Lecture Attendance/Engagement Requirement:

The HCECCE Student is required to meet the 80 % lecture attendance/ online engagement requirement for each of the identified modules as is aligned to ECD Experience for that year to gain access into their ECD Centre-based Experience.

Notes	Student's proficiency in The IIE's Language of Learning and Teaching (LoLT), English, plus partial proficiency (sufficient for basic conversation; i.e. conversational competence) in one other South African official language (excluding Afrikaans) are required components of fundamental learning for this programme. For this, the following will be endorsed on your certificate: LoLT: This higher certificate is delivered in English and thus English is known as the Language of Learning and Teaching (LoLT). On successful completion of this Higher Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education, your certificate will be endorsed with LoLT (English). Locc: If you have an African Language (excluding Afrikaans) as part of your NSC or equivalent, you may receive academic credit for this language. If you are claiming conversational competence in an African Language (excluding Afrikaans), you are required to pass a competency test on NQF Level 5 in order to demonstrate conversational competence in such a language and receive academic credit for this language. Competency tests are offered in four (4) official languages only, namely, isiXhosa, isiZulu, Northern Sotho (Sepedi) and Setswana on The IIE campuses. If conversational competence is claimed in another African language (excluding Afrikaans) other than the four listed above, the onus is on you to provide evidence of NQF Level 5, or higher conversational competence in that language. Once you have demonstrated conversational competence in an African language, and on successful completion of the Higher Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education, your certificate will be endorsed, for example LoCC: isiZulu.
